Editor or Translator

Lattimore, Richmond, trans. *The Iliad of Homer*. Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 1951.

Author AND editor or translator

García Márquez, Gabriel. *Love in the Time of Cholera*. Translated by Edith Grossman. London: Cape, 1988.

Chapter or other part of a book

Preface, foreword, introduction, or similar part of a book

Rieger, James. Introduction to *Frankenstein; or, The Modern Prometheus*, by Mary Wollstonecraft Shelley, xi–xxxvii. Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 1982.

Book published electronically

Cite the version you consulted. Use a URL for books online. Use an access date if you lack a publication date.

Journal

Print journal

In a note, list the specific page numbers consulted, if any. In the bibliography, list the page range for the whole article.

Weinstein, Joshua I. "The Market in Plato's *Republic*." *Classical Philology* 104 (2009): 439–58.

Article in an online journal

Include a DOI (Digital Object Identifier) if the journal lists one. If no DOI is available, use a URL. Use an access date if you lack a publication date.

Article in a newspaper or magazine (including online)
